


### Create your account

## 1 Create your account from the **Turnitin welcome email**.


- Send your information, including **Full-name, Student ID, and Student email account (...@student.chula.ac.th)**, to an instructor for adding your account to a class.




- Once your instructor has added you to a class, you should receive a welcome email from the Turnitin confirming your account's addition. In the **Turnitin welcome email**, click on the **Set up account** button to proceed.

REMARK: If you have not received a welcome email from the Turnitin, check your junk folder. Additionally, contact your instructor to verify that your email address has been entered correctly.

- Follow the instructions sent to your email to set up your Turnitin account.
- Turnitin will send you an email stating "Your Turnitin account is now set up". This email will allow you to log in to Turnitin, set your security question, and start submitting papers.




## 2 Create your account using a class enrollment key.



- To Create a User Profile, click on the Student.

- To enroll in a class, enter the Class ID and Class enrollment key provided by your instructor.



- After completing the user profile creation page, you can now log in to use Turnitin.




## Summit your paper


- Once you have logged in, you should see the class you enrolled in.
- Click on the class name where you need to upload a file.




- Click on the **Open** button to submit your paper to the assignment.



- To submit your paper, click on the **Upload Submission** button.




➤ There are 3 different ways to submit your paper;




- 1 **Upload Submission** > upload file directly to Turnitin.

- 3 **Cloud Submission** > submit a file from a cloud drive.



**Below showcase only the 'Upload Submission' way.**

- You will see a **Submission Complete** notice if your submission was successful.




## View your Submission

Only 51% of HIV-positive individuals in Eastern Europe and Central Asia were receiving treatment in 2021, and 48% (94% of those taking medication) had viral suppression. Currently, they are identified as one of the regions experiencing a rise in new HIV infections. The Middle East and North Africa have seen a notable increase in the knowledge of HIV status among individuals living with the virus, but the region falls behind in HIV treatment; in 2021, 50% of individuals living with HIV received antiretroviral therapy, and 44% (89% of those on treatment) achieved viral suppression. Latin America and the Caribbean are also below the global average for HIV treatment and viral suppression (UNAIDS, 2022). There were substantial disparities in access to antiretroviral therapy with a persisting situation. Around the world, males with HIV are less likely than women to obtain antiretroviral therapy: in 2021, just 70% of men with HIV sought treatment, compared to 80% of women with HIV who received ART. Similarly, worldwide rates of viral suppression are significantly greater among women living with HIV (74%) compared to men living with HIV (65%) (UNAIDS, 2022). In 2017, individuals with HIV who are aware of their status by geographic area were 81% in eastern and southern Africa, the region most afflicted by the virus. Compared to 85% in North America and western and central Europe. However, only 48% of HIV-positive individuals in Western and Central
